B. Old Business

1. IW-A-19-051: Flax Mill Lane over Wepawaug River, City of Milford – proposed replacement of Flax Mill Lane Bridge with construction, grading and drainage in and within 150' of a wetland and watercourse in the Wepawaug River Watershed.

It was an overcast, mild day. MaryRose stated that protection of trees was something that the IWA wanted to see. She proceeded to orient the site to the plan and the large oak tree was viewed. The IWA proceeded to walk over to the stone wall/river/bridge. It was noted that the stone wall would be removed. Brady stated that there would be rip rap along the slope and he oriented the IWA as to where the drainage outlet would be.

Cowden asked about trees. Brady stated that the cluster of trees across the river would likely be removed. The grading location was viewed.

DeFlumeri asked how long the project would take. Brady stated that it would take 6-8 months to complete. Cowden noted that he saw no phragmities on site.

There being no further discussions, the meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.
