
### The Friends of the Milford Library

### 'Light Up the Harbor' 2016 Spring Gala Raises Funds to Support Beth-El Center

## MILFORD FIRE DEPARTMENT PROPANE COLLECTION DAY



The Milford Fire Department will be conducting a "Propane Tank Collection Day" on Saturday, September 17, 2016 to collect propane cylinders (i.e. from gas grills). The collection is for Milford residents only and proof of residency will be required. There is no cost for this collection.

The collection will take place at 55 Wheelers Farms Road, upper parking lot of Fire Station 7. The collection time will be

from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. The following shall be adhered to:

- Have proof of residency ready
- Tanks should be transported in an upright position
- Preferable driver only transporting the tank(s)
- Valve must be in the closed position
- We will take full, partially filled, and empty 20lb tanks
- **DO NOT** vent the tank prior to transporting
- Tanks should be secured in place to prevent accidental tip-over
- Tanks should be transported with the vehicle windows open
- No smoking during the transport of the tank or in the drop off area

## MILFORD HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAPPENINGS

### NACCHO Challenge Grant Award

Congratulations to the Milford Health Department!

The Milford Health Department has been selected as the recipient for a grant from the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO). This award titled "Promoting Community Resilience through Community Conversations" will allow the department to conduct a survey of Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) volunteers to assess their hurricane knowledge, risk perceptions, training experience, communications skills and resources to conduct face to face conversations. The results will be used to develop a training and recruitment program for Milford MRC to serve as Neighborhood Ambassadors. These ambassadors will focus on communicating with residents that reside in flood zone areas regarding storm preparedness, before, during and after events. ### Mosquito Control and Zika Virus

Protect yourself from Mosquitoes and Zika virus this summer!

The Milford Health department wants to increase awareness around the Zika Virus and Mosquito control around your property this summer. Zika virus is a disease that is spread primarily through the bite of an infected mosquito. It can also be spread from unprotected sex with an infected partner and can be passed from a mother to her fetus while pregnant. The illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting for several days to 1 week. Women who are pregnant or plan to get pregnant should avoid travel to Zika stricken areas and use condoms, since the virus is known to cause birth defects in unborn children. To date, all known cases of Zika in the state of CT have been travel-related and/or sexually transmitted.

The Milford Health Department recommends the 3 D's for mosquito control around your property and protection from mosquito bites:

**DRAIN!** Or dump any standing water that may produce mosquitoes, including in ceramic pots, used tires, tree holes and other cavities in plants both indoor and outdoor.

**DRESS!** Wear light colored, loose fitting clothing. When

practical, wear long sleeves and pants.

**DEFEND!** Against mosquito bites by using a mosquito repellent that has been registered by the Environmental Protection Agency, such as DEET, Picaridin, or Oil of lemon eucalyptus. Also protect your home by keeping windows and doors shut and use air conditioning.

## MILFORD OYSTER FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES HEADLINERS

For the first time in its 42 year history, the Milford Oyster Festival will host 2 headline bands this year, Blue Oyster Cult and The Marshall Tucker Band. Both bands will appear on the Festival Main Stage on Saturday, August 20th. "The committee is very excited to bring festival goers 2 top tier rock bands all in one day" said Jay Pinto, Oyster Festival President.



Blue Oyster Cult is an American rock band from Long Island, New York, whose most successful work includes the hard rock and heavy metal songs "(Don't Fear) The Reaper", "Godzilla" and "Burnin' for You". Since the release of their eponymous debut album in 1972, the band has sold over 24 million albums worldwide, including 7 million in the United States alone. The band's music videos, especially "Burnin' for You", received heavy rotation on MTV when the music television network premiered in 1981, cementing the band's contribution to the development and success of the music video in modern pop culture.

The Marshall Tucker Band is an American Southern rock/country rock band originally from Spartanburg, South Carolina. The band's blend of rock, rhythm and blues, jazz, country, and gospel helped establish the Southern rock genre in the early 1970s. "Fire On The Mountain," "Can't You See," and "Take The Highway," earned The Marshall Tucker Band seven gold and three platinum albums.

Opening for the headlining bands will be The RumRunners, one of Connecticut's favorite rock cover bands. Originally from New Haven and Milford the band was formed in 1998. The 42nd Annual Milford Oyster Festival will be held, rain or shine, on Saturday, August 20th, 10:00 a.m. til 6:00p.m. In addition to the Main Stage entertainment the event also includes a new craft beer area at Lisman Landing, the Festival Car Show, Children's Stage at Fowler Field, Armory Square Big Toys, 200 Arts and Crafts vendors on the Green, amusement rides, schooner cruises, canoe and kayak races, and 35,000 Oysters from the East Coast Shellfish Growers Association. Oyster Eve, the festival kick-off event, will be held on Friday, August 19th, from 6:00 p.m. til 10p.m. at Lisman Landing. The featured band will be Eaglemania, a musical tribute band playing all the favorite Eagles tunes. They will also be playing on Saturday afternoon during the festival. Craft beers, wine and oysters as well as other great food will be available on Oyster Eve. The Engineering Bureau would like to remind all property owners that any work performed within the Street Right of Way (including new or replacement sidewalks, curbs and/or driveway aprons) requires a permit available at the Engineering Department. All work needs to be done by an Approved (insured and bonded) Contractor (list of Approved Contractors is available in the Engineering Bureau). Permits are required -prior to the start of any work. Work which has been performed prior to the issuance of a Permit and/or by a Contractor who has not been Approved may be ordered to be removed and replaced by an Approved Contractor after the issuance of a valid Permit at the property owner's expense.
