Consideration of Minutes of May 23, 2011

Mr. Agro and Mr. Fitzpatrick made and seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held May 23, 2011 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Lema pointed out the City is contractually obligated to pay these benefits.

Mr. Agro noted for the record that Mr. Fournier had served the City well for over 35 years and wished him well. He commented regarding future contracts which he stated should be looked at. He stated it is incumbent this Board have a better understanding. Discussion ensued.

Staff Report – No report.

Mr. Fitzpatrick asked about the tax bills and why the homeowner bills are so late. He commented they are losing interest.

Mr. Erodici stated the homeowner tax bills would be going out shortly. He stated it was his understanding there was an issue with the printing.

Chairman Lema noted this is not unique to Milford and noted many towns have not sent their homeowner tax bills out.

Mr. Fitzpatrick reiterated the city was losing interest monies.
