

Licensing Requirements - Engineering

To become a licensed contractor with the City of Milford Engineering Office you need to provide the following:

- A completed application for license to work in Public ROW within City of Milford. (It costs \$25.00 to become licensed which expires on June 30th of every year. So each year you will have to pay \$25.00 to renew your license if you should want to continue working in Milford).
- A \$10,000.00 street opening bond
- An insurance certificate that meets our requirements which are: \$2,000,000.00 general aggregate liability. \$500,000.00 workers Comp for your employees, certificate has to state on it that the City of Milford is additionally insured – not just certificate holder.

Permit:

- Driveway Apron/Sidewalk Permit are only \$25.00 each.
- The Sewer Connection Permit is \$25.00 for single family residential and \$50.00 for multifamily or commercial. A Street Opening Permit \$50 is also required for all Sewer Permits requiring work in the City right of way.

We have a list available of contractors who are already licensed if you should need it.

If you should need to cut open the pavement of the road then you will be required to make a deposit of \$1,500.00 into our trench patch fund which we will hold onto for 2 years. You are to maintain your trench and restore the roadway back to its original condition; if you don't we will hire someone and take the fee out of your \$1,500.00. You have to request the money back after 2 years if you decide you don't want to work in Milford or don't need to open the road again.
