2014 Accomplishments

The Friends of Milford Library, reported its results for 2014 at its recent members' meeting. "We can be proud of what we have accomplished in 2014," noted President Anne Bolin.

During 2014, the Friends of Milford Library:

- Raised over \$14,000, mostly through the ongoing library book sale
- Sponsored adult programs in the amount of over \$5000, funding lectures, concerts, movies, dance programs, workshops and classes such as monthly genealogy classes and the gardening series
- •Supported children's programs in the amount of over \$7000, including the creative writing club for tweens, story hours, summer reading clubs, drama workshops, seasonal passes for families to enjoy Connecticut museums and zoos
- •Set up 'Books for Commuters' at the Milford Train Station.



2015 Program Plans


- The Little Libraries committee will design, construct and stock book kiosks at parks, the railroad station and beaches.

Each of the three new Little Libraries, sponsored by the Friends of the Milford Public Library, have been constructed by interested Little Libraries Committee members and will have stewards, responsible for overseeing it and checking on its stock of books.

The Gulf Beach Little Library is a product of neighbors. It was built by Pat Simon, who lives near Beth Hanson, a member of the Friends of Milford Library's public relations committee. Simon taught and coached in the Milford school system until his retirement a few vears ago. He was assisted by his young grandsons Julian and Tristan. Neighbor Cathy Collins, an art teacher in Milford and member of the Milford Arts Council, provided artistic talent and a sea creature design.

Friday, October 16 at Yale's Library

Join Ken Crilly, Associate University Librarian for Program Development & Research in the Yale University Library, on Friday October 16, at 11:30 AM, as he leads the Friends of the Milford Library on a tour of Yale's Sterling Memorial Library. The gothic-style entrance nave of Sterling underwent an extensive restoration from July 2013 through August 2014. In the nave, we'll see the cleaned and repaired stained glass windows, new lighting which showcases the restored ceilings, upper-level architectural details, the patterning that emerged from cleaning the sandstone and limestone walls, and the repaired mural of Eugene Savage's *Alma* Mater. We'll also learn about the repurposing of several spaces within the nave (such as the old card catalog



areas), so that the space now better supports the activities of a twentyfirst century research library. Beyond the nave, Ken will show us several other reading rooms and collections on the first floor of Sterling, which serves as the

principal library of one of the great academic research libraries in the world. Total tour time: approximately 1 hour.

Board of Directors News


The Board is pleased to announce the recent appointments of Janice Pellegrino as Treasurer of The Friends and Karuna Kasbawala as Assistant Treasurer.
