SCRAPBOOKING WITH PLANTS IN THE 18TH CENTURY

Wednesday, August 9 from 7pm-8pm

Follow Yale Graduate Student Alicia Petersen's fraught journey as she creates an herbarium, a book of dried plants, using manuals written by 18th-century naturalists. Alongside her own adventures, Alicia will explore those of early modern naturalists to consider how scientific knowledge was made in the West. This talk emphasizes that 18th-century science was not a solitary experience. Instead, it was a collective process rooted in a broad community of practitioners.
