Public Comment

Daniel Rusanowsky, 201 Wolf Harbor Road, commented on the water pressure at the community gardens. He stated that since the splash pad and new dog park were installed the water pressure has decreased and is not sufficient for those who use the community gardens.

Director's Report

Director Piscitelli stated he has no knowledge of where the water pipes for the community gardens originate from or flow through. He stated the splash pad has a new water service coming from North Street behind the tennis courts. Director Piscitelli further stated he thought these were dedicated lines and will try to get maps showing the lines for review. Director Piscitelli stated lifeguard service started on Memorial Day Weekend and although Milford was shown on Channel 8 News, Milford does not have a lifeguard shortage. He provided an update on the parking meters which are not yet installed. Director Piscitelli state the meters at Walnut Beach will be pay by numbered

space and there will be one meter at Gulf Beach that is pay and display. Director Piscitelli stated summer camp starts in 3 weeks, staff is in place and orientation is coming up. He stated that the lights at Foote Field are in place and working well.

Commissioner Reports

a) Golf Course Commission – Chairman Worroll reported the Golf Commission is in the process of redoing the operation contract that expires the end of this year. He further reported that rounds are up.

b) Bench Dedication Program – Director Piscitelli reported that benches previously purchased are slowly getting installed. Commissioner Bevan asked if the bench at the dog park was purchased by the City. Director Piscitelli stated it was purchased by animal control. Chairman Worroll stated he attended the dog park opening and looked as though everyone was enjoying the park.
