He explained the history of the development of the needs assessment of headquarters brought forward by former Mayor Lisman, followed by another study commissioned by Mayor Richetelli and each study determined the need for more space for the Department. He added Mayor Blake agrees it is necessary to take a better look at the needs of the Department and authorized a study committee be formed. Chief stated that committee, met recently for the first time and participated in a walk thru of the entire facility. He added he looks forward to working with the committee on this matter.

Further, Chief Mello reported the federal seized asset funds, which has been very important to this Department, have been put on hold as they are looking at a deficit in that area and the money allocated to law enforcement groups will be used to offset that deficit. He added last month Senator Murphy staff person had inquired what the needs of this Department were, unbeknownst to the Chief that these cuts were coming forward, he emphasized the importance of these funds to law enforcement.

Chairman Smith referred to the Police Department Building Committee and noted after participating in the walk thru of the facility, it is evident there is a need for additional space for the Department.
