Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Notice
of Funding Availability (NOFA) and Public Hearing

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced its annual Entitlement Grant awards and the City of Milford will receive \$515,464 in Program 46 (PY46). With this Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) the City of Milford, Department of Economic and Community Development (ECD) invites non-profit organizations and local agencies to submit a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for activity funding in Program Year 46 beginning October 1, 2020.

In February, the City received comment during the public participation process to establish new goals and objectives required to prepare the 2020-2025 Five-Year Strategic Consolidated Plan. In accordance with the Consolidated Plan, the PY46 Annual Action Plan participation process will allocate the annual Entitlement grant locally based on the activity applications that meet the Five-Year Strategic Consolidated Plan Goals and Objectives. The new Five-Year Goals and Objective are listed in the FY20 application program guideline.

The FY20 application is due on or before **Wednesday May 13, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.** in the Department of Economic and Community Development, Parsons Government Complex, 70 W. The ECD staff and Housing Partnership Committee invites the public and all applicants to present FY20 application proposal at a second public hearing scheduled on **Wednesday, May 27, 2020 at 6:00pm**, Parsons Government Complex, 70 West River Street, 2nd floor Conference Room B, Milford, CT. The 2020-2025 Five-Year Strategic Consolidated Plan, PY46 Annual Action Plan and an Analysis of Impediments will be noticed for a 30-day public comment period in July.
