The Sewer Commission of the City of Milford held a Public Hearing on Wednesday, April 27, 2016 in Conference Room A of the Parsons Government Center, 70 West River Street, Milford, CT.

Chairman Robert Carroll opened the regular meeting at 6:00 p.m.

The City of Milford, Connecticut, hereby gives notice of a public hearing to be held on Wednesday, April 27, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Parsons Complex, 70 W. River Street, Milford, Connecticut, in Conference Room A by the Sewer Commission with reference to expanding the Downtown Milford Sewer District, special sewer district. The expansion is to include the properties on Buckingham Avenue from the intersection of Gulf Street east to the intersection of New Haven Avenue and the properties on the north side of New Haven Avenue from the intersection of Gulf Street east to the intersection of Buckingham Avenue. The owners of properties to be affected shall have an opportunity to be heard concerning the proposed sewer district expansion.

Ray Macaluso, Westcott and Mapes, referred to the assessor's map depicting the parcels proposed to be expanded into this district and surrounding area. Currently the allowed flow is 1,500 gpd (gallons per day) and the Milford Downtown Sewer District allows for 7,500 gpd. He explained that he prepared an analysis pertaining to the sanitary sewer flows for additional properties located on the north side of New Haven Avenue between Gulf Street and Old Buckingham to determine if this area could be included in the Milford Downtown Sewer District to make sure there were no adverse impacts to the existing sanitary sewer system. These special districts were proposed to allow for economic growth in those areas limited by sewer flow. He added that the capacity is there for this and the Rogers Ave pump station is only running on one

pump and is due for an upgrade and can handle the additional flow. He added that this is 17+ acres that would be added to the special district and requested the Commission's approval.

Chairman Carroll called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:10pm.

Commissioner Hubler made a motion to adjourn the Public Hearing at 6:10 pm seconded by Commissioner Collier. The motion carried unanimously.
