Public Works Bulk Pickup Schedule Fall 2019

Items set out for collection are to be placed at the curb not sooner than the Saturday prior to the scheduled date of the collection and all items are to be at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled pickup date.

In order to qualify for this free pickup service, the homeowner must properly prepare and separate the bulky waste.

Metal must be separated from burnable items. Yard waste should be placed in disposable containers or bags. Brush and wood must be cut to four-foot lengths and tied in bundles. No more than four passenger car tires may be included in the items set out for collection.

Where possible, similar items should be placed together in

containers, which the home-

owner wishes to discard. All

acceptable items placed at the

curb will be taken, INCLUD-ING CONTAINERS.

Prohibited Materials: Certain items are PROHIBITED from the Bulky Waste Pickup program. The following items WILL NOT BE PICKED UP, and therefore, should not be placed at the curb:

- Batteries
- Commercial Items
- Logs & Stumps
- Concrete or cement (Any item requiring more than 2 men to pick up
- Hazardous Waste, Liquid Waste, oil based paint, motor oil
- Propane Tanks
- Grass Clippings
- Sheetrock and Demolition material**

**Sheetrock & Demolition MUST be brought to Waste Conversion, 211 Old Gate Lane, Milford, CT. It will no longer be

accepted at the Transfer Station.

MILFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY

Library Renovation! In November of 2017, the Library was the recipient of a construction grant from the CT State Library to make some much needed updates to our building. With matching funds from the City, and much support from our municipal leaders and other City departments, we are poised to get started! The renovations will include an expansion of our Children's Department to make it more ADA accessible, added space for different age levels with appropriate technology centers, and a more comfortable layout so that families can stay, mingle and meet others - so necessary to building the community relationships we cherish. The second phase of the project will add two small, public meeting spaces on our adult floor, and require the relocation of the Local History Room.

The project is scheduled to begin on October I, and last approximately 6 months. During construction, the Children's Department will be relocated to our adult Program Room, easily accessible from the lower level entrance. Also, during this time the Library will decrease the number of programs, speakers and concerts offered; however we will remain open for all other services. Some programs will be held in other venues, so please check our monthly calendar for updated program schedules.

We are excited for this adventure to start and can't wait to share our improved space with you once completed. In the meantime, we hope to see you in the library and will keep you posted on renovation updates. We are investigating options for a more accessible lower level book return and will keep you update when/if that becomes available. ENGINEERING

<u>Sidewalks, Curbs, Driveway Aprons</u> The City Right of Way between the edge of the roadway surface and the property line shall be kept in a neat and graded manner free and clear of all bushes, fences, planters, litter. Obstructions, including basketball hoops, are not allowed. No plantings should be placed in this area and it shall be free and clear of holes and defects that would endanger pedestrians. The replacement of a sidewalk, curb or driveway apron is the responsibility of the homeowner and must be performed by a licensed contractor (List provided by Engineering) who is issued a permit from the Engineering Department. Said permit ranges from \$25.00 to \$75.00 and the repairs/replacement must be constructed in accordance with City of Milford specifications.

Sump Pumps, Foundation Drains, Gutter Leaders All of the above must be handled so they do not become a nuisance. There are several ways acceptable to the Engineering Department. The staff is available to assist you with the best solution.

Construct a dry well on your property Connect the drains to the storm sewers if avail-

able (permit required and licensed contractor)
3) Drains **cannot** be connected to sanitary sewers under any circumstances.


Three Great Reasons To Put Historical Society On Your Calendar





<u>Tax Collector's Reminder – Motor Vehicle Address Change:</u>
This is a reminder to taxpayers moving within the State of Connecticut to update your address with Department of Motor Vehicle. Motor Vehicle. cle tax bills are mailed based upon where your car is registered. Connecticut law requires all Connecticut residents with a vehicle registration, driver's license, or non-driver identification card to notify the DMV within 48 hours of any change of address. This applies to both individuals and

organizations.

Please pay attention to make sure the mailing address is correct AND the tax town is correct on your registration. Also, check the expiration

Please visit www.ct.gov/DMV and follow the link labeled "Change Your Address." Then, please complete, print and mail the change of address

Next, DMV instructs: "On registration, cross out the old address and write the new address in the space provided. Obtain an address label from any Police Department or by calling DMV's Customer Contact Center 1-800-842-8222. Place the new address label on the back of your license or non-drive ID."

The change of address form also allows one to register to vote and

change your organ/tissue donor status.

If you change your address, there is a chance that you may not receive your motor vehicle tax bill in a timely manner. The July bills are based off of assessments from the prior October. If you change your address on or after October 1st, please check with both your prior and current

town. It is likely that your bill may be generated from your prior town. If you move out-of-state, please cancel/return your plates to Connecticut DMV and report that to the city Assessor. Additional information may be required.





required.



Tanks should be transported in an upright position; driver only transporting the tank(s) is preferred; valve must be in the closed position; full, partially filled and empty 20-pound tanks will be accepted; don't vent the tank prior to transporting; tanks

should be secured in place to prevent accidental tip-over; tanks should be transported with the vehicle windows open; no smoking is allowed during the transport of the tank or in the drop-off area.
