Milford joins Make Music Day by filling our streets with music. We encourage residents to sign up and find a corner to strum, drum or sing on Thursday, June 21, 2018. A piano will be placed on the steps of City Hall and we encourage you to pop by and tickle the ivories, bring a bag lunch and enjoy the music in the parkette in front of City Hall. Stay tuned for more locations and follow us on Facebook at @MilfordCityHall for updates. Make Music Day is a one-day event where free, live musical performances, opportunities to make music and other musical events take place around the world on the longest day of the year. Musical festivities in Milford are part of a global celebration of music making in over 750 cities inspired by France's Fête de la Musique.

MILFORD MARINE INSTITUTE

The Milford Marine Institute, Inc. will be celebrating our 35th year of running Marine Biology, Marine Biology Art, Bird Identification Art, Archaeology/Native Culture Camps (two sessions) this June and July.

The two Marine Biology camps will meet at the Tri Beach Neighborhood Center ages 7-14 with older campers called camper/counselors

Marine Biology June 18-22 learning 9 marine habitats and marine animals (whales, dolphins, porpoise, pinnipeds, sea turtles, sharks, fish, mollusks which inhabit them. Campers will make an entire collection of long Island Sound marine mollusks after handling rare large mollusks from the Institute's collections. They will learn to seine and to set up a temporary aquarium and learn to use a field guide.

Marine Bio. Art (June 25-29) Campers will

learn the habitats and marine animals, choose several favorites and draw them on a piece of pine, have it cut out, sand and paint it to take home

Bird Id Art (July 2-6) Campers will learn the many types of birds from our Bird Observatory, mounts, and trails: long legged waders, waterfowl, birds of prey, shorebirds and then pick a favorite bird, draw it on a piece of pine board, have it cut out, sand and paint it.

Mosquito Control and Zika Virus

Protect yourself from mosquitoes this summer!

The Milford Health department wants to increase awareness around mosquito-borne diseases and mosquito control around your property this summer.

The Milford Health Department recommends the 3 D's for mosquito control around

your property and protection from mosquito bites:

- DRAIN! Or dump any standing water that may produce mosquitoes, including in ceramic pots, used tires, tree holes and other cavities in plants both indoor and outdoor.
- DRESS! Wear light colored, loose fitting clothing. When practical, wear long sleeves and pants.
- 3. **DEFEND!** Against mosquito bites by using a mosquito repellent that has been registered by the Environmental Protection Agency, such as DEET, Picaridin, or Oil of lemon eucalyptus. Also protect your home by keeping windows and doors shut and use air conditioning.

- Current Lease/Mortgage Statement
- Two current utility bills with the same name and address as indicated on the lease/mortgage statement.
- Immunization Record If you have questions or need help, please contact your child's school.

The Annual Milford Oyster Festival announces 2018 Headline Band

The 44th Annual Milford Oyster Festival will host Eddie Money on the Festival Main Stage on Saturday, August 18th.

"The festival is excited to introduce Eddie Money as its Main Stage headliner this year. Eddie Money will bring a classic rock sound that is loved by all ages for an afternoon of fun." says Festival President Ila Tokarz.



Eddie Money has been rocking audiences for over 40 years. Born Edward Joseph Mahoney on March 21, 1949, in Brooklyn, New York, Eddie always wanted to be a musician, but he decided to follow in his Father's footsteps and became a Police Officer. After being in law enforcement for 2 years, he decided to try music, moved to California and changed his name to Eddie Money. After meeting the legendary producer, Bill Graham and signing on with Columbia Records, Money's

career took off with his 1977 debut album. "Baby Hold On" and

"Two Tickets to Paradise" became quick hits and were followed by a stream of top 40 hits including "Think I'm in Love" and "Shakin." Another platinum hit was "Take Me Home

Tonight" with Ronnie Spector. These days in addition to maintaining a busy touring schedule, Money has been featured on hit television shows like "The King of Queens," and "The Drew Carey Show." He is also starring on the reality show, "Real Money" on AXS TV.

Opening for Eddie Money will be the legendary East Coast rock and roll group John Cafferty & The Beaver Brown Band. From Rhode Island, they began their career in 1972 and achieved mainstream success in the 1980s with hits like "Wild Summer"

Nights" and "Tender Years." They also did a number of movie soundtracks including 'Eddie & The Cruisers - Original Motion Picture Soundtrack' and On the Dark Side." Their hit song "Hearts on Fire" was featured on "Rocky IV."

The Milford Oyster Festival will be held, rain or shine, on Saturday, August 18th, from 10:00a.m. till 6:00p.m. In addition to the Main Stage entertainment, the event also includes a craft beer area at Lisman Landing, the Festival Car Show, Children's Stage at Fowler Field,

Bird Walk and Book Signing at Milford Library June 27 at 6:30pm

Frank Gallo loves birds. He is a leading expert on where to find birds in Connecticut and has led birding expeditions all over the world. Gallo is a tour leader for Sunrise Birding, LLC, an international birding tour company, is a member of the Connecticut Avian Rare Records Committee, and a federally licensed master bird bander. He is also the author of two children's nature books, *Bird Calls* and *Night Sounds*, and is a published freelance photographer.
